A separate document provides a graphical representation of what the young heads of household and their families have achieved after three years in the empowerment program. The information details specific achievements of participants, but what it cannot fully capture are the many ways the Zoe youth have impacted their local community. Nor does it include data on the many single parents or elderly relatives who live with the youth and have shared in the life improvements. Your commitment may have been limited to three years for this specific group of youth and children, but its effects will last a lifetime and ripple forward to many others in need.
